



DAY 4

Here are the games we played today, SUPER WHY DAY! We learned how changing words in a sentence changes its meaning. We also learned how to read the words; big, bad, small and good! You can play them at home.

DRAW YOUR OWN ADVENTURE CRAFT ACTIVITY

Campers took turns drawing pictures and telling 'the story' of their pictures. After they drew their pictures, the teacher asked them what their pictures were about and wrote what each camper said on his picture. To make the game harder, the teacher asked each camper to draw a picture and then put the pictures side-by-side to tell a longer story.

Play at home by drawing pictures with your child. Tell each other the story that is happening in each of your pictures. Write what your child says on her picture as her story. To make it harder, ask your child to draw a picture, tell its story, and then (take turns or have your child do it all herself) draw another picture that tells the next part of the story.

PIN THE TAIL ON THE WORD GAME

Campers picked word choices read by the teacher to put into blank spaces in sentences. The campers then tried to act out the sentence to show the meaning of the sentence they just created.

At home, write out a sentence with a blank space; For example, "The boy went to the ____." Or "The girl ____ to her friend." Write different words into the blank space and act out the new meaning of the sentence.

SUPER WHY OPPOSITE RELAY

Campers were told a word. They pretended to fly to the end of the room where three words were placed on a "Why Board," like Super Why uses on the show! Once they got to the three words, the campers read the words and 'zapped' the one that they thought was the opposite into their hands. Then they pretended to fly back to the front of the room with the opposite word.

Practice opposites with your child. Ask, what is the opposite of big? What is the opposite of in? Set up your own relay with your child – have her run to the other side of the room to pick the correct opposite OR ask your child for the opposite and you both have to act it out or show opposites with things around your house.
